Organised by the SCELf (Société Civile des Éditeurs de Langue Française) and BIEF (Bureau International de l'Édition française), this event will assemble those in charge of film rights in French publishing houses, for the first time in Cannes, and in a collective context.

Shoot the Book! is an opportunity for French publishers to present books with strong potential for film and TV adaptation at the Cannes Festival.

Created in 2013 by BIEF and SCELf, this all-English Internet site is designed to be a bridge between the written word and the image.

Here, film and TV rights managers in French publishing houses can present books they believe to have a strong potential for screen adaptation, at any time of the year.

Thanks to a multi-criteria search engine, film industry professionals visiting the site can select titles by category, key words, characters, period, etc. depending on the project they are working on. They can also leave a message to a group of publishers for more detailed information. In order to make the site as rich as possible, we are planning further developments such as the creation of an agenda listing all the major film festivals in the world, and a list of professional organisations of producers. Our aim is to make this site an international portal for book-to-film adaptation.

BIEF ensures the collective presence of French publishing in many international book fairs, organizes professional seminars between French and foreign publishers and conducts marketing research in the publishing sector throughout the world.

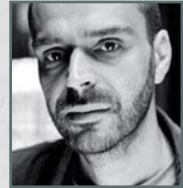

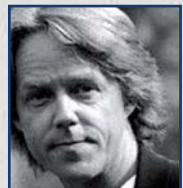

Back Up

1967. Four members of a rock band die one after the other, just after making a recording. Is there any connection between their deaths and the old man found unconscious in a Brussels train station, now in a coma, more than forty years later?

Berlin, 1967. All four members of the rock band Pearl Harbor have died after recording their first album. An Irish journalist starts investigating. Brussels, 2010. A homeless man (called X Midi), is hit by a car and taken to hospital unconscious. The new therapist, Dominique, figures out that X Midi has experienced a traumatic event and decides to find out more.

The two investigations intertwine, since X Midi is the only man alive who knows why the band died. They have to find out why X Midi moved, in 1967, from Brussels to Paris then to London; why he wanted to become a famous drummer; how he started recording for "Pearl Harbor" and why so many people died; why he too will die.

During the Vietnam war, scientists and the CIA tested the effects of ultrasonic and subliminal messages on human behavior and consciousness.

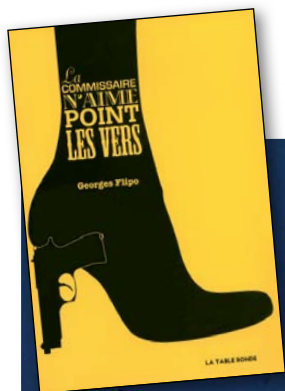

The Commissaire Is Not a Poetry Fan

A torrid sonnet supposedly written by Baudelaire turns into a “serial killer” as everyone who shows any interest in it winds up as a corpse in the morgue.

Commissaire Viviane Lancier is definitely not the literary type, yet she is destined to develop a passion for poetry when a bearded down-and-out, with an uncanny likeness to Victor Hugo, is murdered in front of the Académie française just as he is about to deposit an erotic sonnet supposedly written by Baudelaire.

Assisted by her young and naive lieutenant – who also happens to be very cute – Viviane Lancier becomes involved in an investigation where the dead, the living, and even ghosts seem to be mocking her.

Written in a vivacious and amusing style, this detective novel, full of witty dialogues, is also a caustic satire of media and power in today's society.

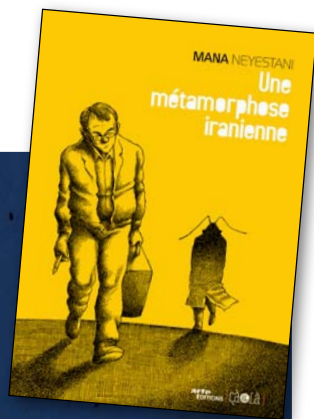

An Iranian Metamorphosis

The true story of an Iranian illustrator who ends up in prison because his work provoked a misunderstanding and set off riots in his country. He will do anything in his power to flee his homeland.

When Mana Neyestani, an Iranian cartoonist, drew a cockroach in a cartoon for a children's magazine in 2006, he could never have imagined that the insect would unleash a political uproar that would destroy him. When he aroused the anger of the Azari, a Turkish minority, he became a scapegoat for the Tehran regime and found himself in prison, in a Kafkaesque spiral of events from which he desperately sought to escape. After two nerve-racking months spent inside Iran's notorious Evin prison in Tehran, he was temporarily released on bail. His intention was to turn this situation to his advantage by requesting political asylum for himself and his wife in Europe or Canada, but their troubles were far from over. A long battle lay ahead, against the bureaucracy of various countries. Their long journey would take them through Turkey, China and Malaysia before reaching France.

In Kenya, Naïm escapes from his brother who wants him to go back to the Koranic school. In his flight, he meets some colorful characters whose destinies he soon discovers.

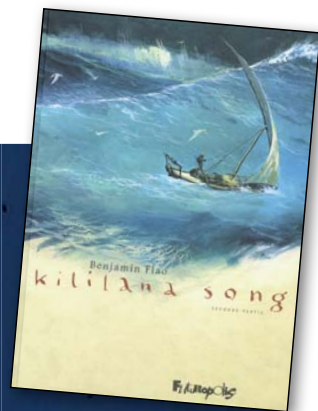
In the harbour of Lamu, 11-year-old Naïm is driving his brother mad. He doesn't want to go back to the Koranic school. He runs away and meets with some colourful characters. Like the old countryman, Ali, guardian of the remains of a legendary hero: Liongo Fumo. The sacred sepulchre is threatened by a project to build a luxury hotel on Kililana island. And Captain Günter Vogel, captain of a Dutch boat that carries an illegal cargo, a man deep in debt and about to get kidnapped. Naïm also meets Jean-Philippe, a Frenchman, who at first enjoyed the easy life of a foreigner in Kenya but then fell prey to cocaine, and Suzy, a beautiful prostitute who specializes in expats. A new problem arises, one that might destroy the local economy and biodiversity: a huge harbour and an oil terminal are planned soon. But the danger is soon retreats: by the hand of providence? Or the spirit of Liongo Fumo?

Plague and Cholera

A wonderful epic about the exceptional destiny of Alexandre Yersin, a former student of Louis Pasteur fallen into oblivion, who discovered the bacillus for the plague in the late 19th c.

Among the young researchers who made up the first team at the Pasteur Institute, created in Paris in 1887, it was Swiss-born researcher Alexandre Yersin who led the most adventurous life. He left for Asia early on, became a sailor, then an explorer. In 1894, he discovered the plague bacillus in Hong Kong; then he settled permanently in Indochina, in Nha Trang, far from the hubbub of wars. There, he continued his scientific observations, developing the cultivation of rubber trees and cinchonas. He died in 1943 during the Japanese occupation.

To recount this great human and scientific adventure, Patrick Deville followed in Yersin's footsteps around the world, devouring the correspondence and documents in the archives of various Pasteur Institutes.

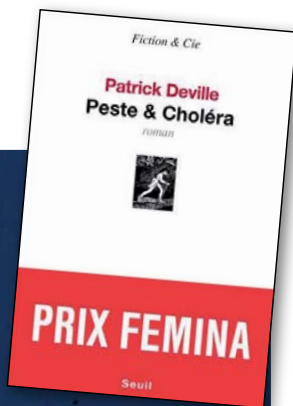

The Problem with Jane

What if you were to find a book about you? A novel that would describe your everyday life, your love life, the lot! And what if the anonymous author had got it right?

Jane, a young lecturer at Devayne University, has just divorced Eric. As she is leaving home one morning, Jane stumbles upon an envelope left for her in which she finds a manuscript entitled "The Problem with Jane, novel". No author's name, no sender. Jane starts reading and realizes this novel is all about her: her love life, or more precisely her affairs...

Jane wonders who knows her well enough to write such a novel, so right and so precise about her feelings. She suspects everyone in her entourage and starts thinking she might be in danger. The final pages of the manuscript relate her relationship with Alex Letterman, a man with whom Jane has been corresponding via email for several months, and subsequently fallen in love with from afar. Jane finally guesses the author's identity: a man who loves her deeply and knows their relationship is impossible.

Scissors

“Scissors” is loosely based on Raymond Carver’s life story. This is a story of a man ready to do anything to become a writer.

US of A. The 1970s. Raymond is a writer; his wife, Marianne, is a waitress. They struggle to make ends meet while Raymond dreams about being published. His encounter with the editor-in-chief of a famous magazine, Douglas –nicknamed “Scissors”– will prove a life-changing but also devastating experience. Because Douglas butchers Raymond’s work. They have an ambivalent relationship, verging from friendship to the search for gratification, from admiration to secret hatred. Raymond won’t have the courage to rebel until he meets Joanne. She will be his last true love and the one who will release him from his demons. But by that time it’s already too late: Raymond dies at 50, at the height of his fame. This is the true story of one of the most legendary duels in the history of American literature: a story of love and deceit, of youth and booze, and an eternal tale of passion, for life and for literature.

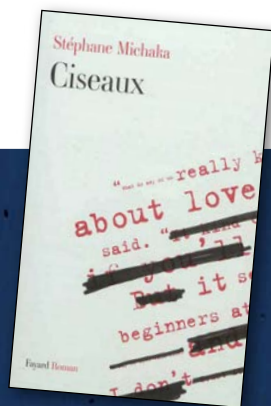

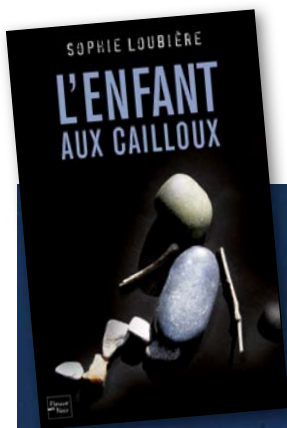

Who is the real Mrs Préau? A dangerous, paranoid lunatic? A lonely grandmother? Or the only person who has noticed the suffering of her neighbour's eldest child?

70-year-old Elsa Préau comes home after several years' convalescence to find she has new neighbours. 2 children live in the Desmoulins' house – but a third child occasionally appears. Sickly-looking, sad and ignored by the rest of the family, the boy seems to cry out to her for help by throwing tiny stones against her window.

Elsa is determined to come to the child's rescue even if the social services and the police refuse to listen to her. She comes uninvited with homemade cakes that she has drugged in a bid to put them all to sleep. But Mr. Desmoulins attacks her, and she falls into a coma that will later prove fatal. The police investigation into the family leads nowhere, while everything seems to point to Mme. Préau's insanity. Months later, however, new inhabitants move into the Desmoulins' house and renovation work finally reveals that "the stone boy" was real.

A Window on the Bosphorus

In an Istanbul occupied by the Allies after WWI, Leyla, a modern, clever woman, is caught between her duty to her family and her duty to her nation.

Since the Ottoman Empire was on the losing side of WWI, Istanbul has been occupied by the French, British and Italians. Leyla, a young woman, and her husband, Selim, an advisor to the Sultan, are ordered to share their home with Louis Gardelle, a French officer, and his family. A culture clash is inevitable and can only lead to tragedy.

The occupation creates tension between Leyla and Selim; while he remains loyal to the Sultan, she secretly supports the Turkish nationalists fighting for freedom. She falls in love with Hans, a German helping the Turks, an affair which puts a strain on her loyalty to her husband and children.

The Armistice of 1922 brings an end to the sultanate and a new beginning of hope for Leyla. When she is finally free to be with Hans, he is killed in a tragic act of bravery. Nonetheless, now an independent woman, Leyla is ready to face Turkey's future as well as her own.
