

Shoot the Book!

This event is a SCELF's (Société Civile des Editeurs de Langue Française) and BIEF's (Bureau International de l'Edition Française) initiative. It is organised by SCELF, the IIe de France Film Commission, the MOTif (Observatoire du livre et de l'écrit), the Institut Français, and supported by the Centre Français de la Copie, the Sofia and the CNL.

This event will assemble those in charge of film rights in French publishing houses, for the second time in Cannes and in a collective context.

Shoot the Book! is an opportunity for French publishers to present books with strong potential for film adaptation at the Cannes Festival.

Out of 27 participants, 10 publishing houses had the pleasure of seeing their book selected by a jury of professionals working in the film industry.

This event was organised in collaboration with Isabelle Fauvel, director of Initiative Film, Bertrand Moullier, director of Narval Media Ltd, Sophie Balhetchet, British producer, Emma Broughton, book executive at BBC and Cedric Salmon, director and scriptwriter. It will be Moderated by Isabelle Fauvel. The pitch presentation session will be followed by a cocktail at 11.30 am.

Created in 2013 by BIEF and SCELF, this all-English Internet site is designed to be a bridge between the written word and the image.

Here, film and TV rights managers in French publishing houses can present books they believe to have a strong potential for screen adaptation, at any time of the year.

Thanks to a multi-criteria search engine, film industry professionals visiting the site can select titles by category, key words, characters, period, etc. depending on the project they are working on. They can also leave a message to a group of publishers for more detailed information.

In order to make the site as rich as possible, we are planning further developments such as the creation of an agenda listing all the major film festivals in the world, and a list of professional organisations of producers. Our aim is to make this site an international portal for book-to-film adaptation.

What can Haiti hold for a young woman who becomes an under-age mother after a single night of passion? The Colour of the Dawn paints a portrait of disenchanted Haitian youth, divided between disillusionment and rebellion.





Each tome has been in the official selection at the Angouleme Festival in the year of its publication.

On that same hill lives Monsieur de Fontenaille, an eccentric coffee planter who is fascinated by the Tutsi, believing them to be the descendants of the black pharaohs of Meroe. He paints the young Tutsi girls with passion, stigmatizing them even more when their presence in the school is only just tolerated. In this closed world, the government's call to 'deTutsify' institutions is heard loud and clear by the young 'patriots'. The Tutsi pupils are bullied even more than before, with the complicity of the chaplain, while mother superior pretends not to see... 

Les orchidées rouges de Shanghai traces the story of Kim Sangmi. Born into a wealthy family in Korea in 1923, when the country was under Japanese occupation, she grows up in a complex situation with her family. As a teenager, she learns from her grandfather that her real father is a Frenchman her mother was forbidden from marrying. We follow Sangmi's life over more than 10 years, from her abduction in 1937 to Japan's surrender in 1945. She is taken against her will several times and even deported. She remains a 'comfort woman', tossed back and forth from brothels to camps. From Shanghai to Hiroshima, this novel follows the destiny of a strong woman whose fate is tied to the history of Asia. In spite of being faced with the most horrendous hardships, Sangmi manages to pick herself up and rise to the occasion. After the attack on Hiroshima, she makes her way to Germany to finally take control of her life and set herself free.
